2020 Speakers

Russell Hedrick is a first generation farmer from Hickory, North Carolina. He started farming on 30 acres in 2012. Russell now produces corn, soybeans and specialty grains on nearly 1,000 acres. With guidance from the NRCS Russell started out with no-till and cover crops primarily to avoid erosion. Continued experience with no-till and multispecies cover cropping has reaped multiple benefits: improved yields, reduced water stress, less capital outlay, a buildup of organic matter and improved soil health. Cattle and hogs have been integrated into the farming operation. They not only diversify the income stream but by grazing cover crops the soil health of the crop fields improves at an accelerated rate. Hedrick will share his experiences and philosophies for maximizing profitability while improving the sustainability of his farming operation.

Josh Walker and Richard Fitzgerald will review the latest programs promoting manure injection. Josh is the field technician for the Headwaters SWCD. He has worked diligently to secure funding for manure injection equipment and funding support to increase the adoption of the technology. Prior to joining the Headwaters SWCD, Josh was a dairy farmer for 13 years. Richard is a consulting agronomist who spearheaded the initial manure injection research in the Shenandoah Valley. Richard grew up on a family dairy operation and liquid fertilizer business in Stuarts Draft Va. He is a certified professional agronomist and certified nutrient management planner. Richard was the 2019 recipient of the Carl Luebben Soil Health and Water Quality Award.

Daniel Austin is a farmer in the foothills of the Blue Ridge Mountains, between Ferrum and Rocky Mount, VA. He grows a diverse mix of grain, on 170 acres, that he retails in his seed and feed business. His focus is on no-till farming systems with an emphasis on soil health and profitability. Daniel was the 2018 recipient of the Carl Luebben Soil Health and Water Quality Award.

Dr. Michael Flessner is an assistant professor and extension weed science specialist in the School of Plant and Environmental Sciences at Virginia Tech. His research and extension program focuses on solving weed management challenges currently facing the Commonwealth, with emphasis placed on sustainable and economic solutions. Herbicide resistance is a major threat to crop productivity, sustaining no-till and profitability. Using cover crops for weed management is one integrated solution to this problem. Research indicates that high biomass cover crops can greatly reduce winter annual weeds such as horseweed (aka marestail) and provide a mulch layer that suppresses weeds into subsequent cash crops, including some of our most problematic and herbicide resistant weeds.

David Mayonado has served as a Technology Development Representative for Monsanto for the past 25 years. He will provide the training for using the new low volatile dicamba products on dicamba tolerant soybeans. David graduated from Bridgewater College in 1982. He has a strong background in chemistry, plant physiology and weed science. David is active in the Weed Science Society of America and the Northeastern Weed Science Society. He is a native of Maryland and currently resides in Hebron, Maryland.
